Is something eating your petunias? Should you add sawdust to your garden soil? How do you get rid of gophers?

Get free assistance with all garden-related questions and problems, as well as insect identification, at the Master Gardener Plant Clinic.

"We're here to help," says Wilma Christian, the plant clinic coordinator. "If we don't have the answer, we know where to go to get the information."

The clinic is at the Oregon State

University Extension Office, 215 Ringuette St., in Grants Pass. It's open Tuesdays and Thursdays, 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. through March, then Monday through Thursday from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m., starting April 1.

Master Gardeners field questions about everything from leaf curl on peach leaves, blossom end rot on tomatoes and black spots on photinia, to identifying insect larvae and spiders, getting soil tests done and pruning wisteria.
